Eleven Straight Non-Losing Preseasons

The Jets have not had a losing preseason since 1996 (1-3), the year prior to both Mike Tannenbaum's arrival and Eric Mangini's first stint with the team. Since that time, the Jets have produced eight winning preseasons, including 4-0 records in 1997 and 2002, and three preseasons with a .500 mark. Coach Mangini is 5-3 in two preseasons. What follows is the year-by-year preseason and regular season records from 1997-2007:

Penalties at a Minimum

In 2007, the Jets were assessed 63 penalties for 486 yards, the second-lowest number of penalties in the league. Since the start of the 2006 season when Eric Mangini became head coach, the Jets have been penalized 133 times, the lowest total in the NFL and more than 10 percent less (14) than the next-lowest total.

Last Year's Preseason Opener

8/10/07 Jets Down Falcons, 31-16

The New York Jets defeated the Atlanta Falcons, 31-16 in their 2007 preseason opener at the Meadowlands as Kellen Clemens connected on 16-of-22 passes for 174 yards and three touchdowns and Leon Washington, in a prelude of things to come in 2007, hit on an 86-yard kickoff return to set up a Thomas Jones touchdown. Sean Ryan had four receptions for 29 yards and two touchdowns while Chansi Stuckey also caught a 13-yard scoring pass from Clemens.

For the majority of the first half the Jets opted to utilize their running game as Chad Pennington did not throw a pass. The Jets executed 16 consecutive rushing plays before attempting their first pass with 6:56 remaining in the second quarter. Brad Smith attempted the first pass on fourth-and-three on a fake punt, but it was incomplete.

2007 Jets Honors

2007 Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie Team: LB David Harris and CB Darrelle Revis.

NFL Rookie of the Month (November): LB David Harris - Harris posted 37 tackles with one sack in three games and totaled double-digit tackles in two of the three games. The rookie linebacker led the team with a career-high 20 tackles vs. WAS (11/4). Harris posted 11 tackles and his second sack of the season in the Jets 19-16 overtime win vs. PIT (11/18). On Thanksgiving Day, Harris registered six tackles in his final performance of the month.

NFL Defensive Player of the Week (Week 11): DE Shaun Ellis

-Ellis recorded five tackles, 2.0 sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in a 19-16 overtime win over PIT (11/18). In the fourth quarter with PIT driving in Jets territory, Ellis registered his second sack of quarterback Ben Roethlisberger, stripped the ball away and returned it six yards to thwart the Steelers drive. The eight-year veteran registered his eighth career game with at least two sacks. Ellis also tied Mo Lewis for fifth place on the Jets all-time sacks list with 52.5. The Jets registered seven sacks in the game, which was the team's highest total since 2003 against BUF (10/12).

Motorola Coach of the Week (Week 11): Eric Mangini

- Coached his Jets to a 19-16 overtime win over the Pittsburgh Steelers (11/18). Jets registered seven sacks in the game, which was the team's highest total since 2003

Team MVP – Leon Washington

After the Jets lost Pro Bowl kick returner Justin Miller for the season, the team turned to second-year running back Leon Washington, who was named the team's Most Valuable Player. His 2007 accomplishments:

- Washington returned a Jets-record three kickoffs for touchdowns – a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. MIA (9/23); a 98-yarder at NYG (10/7) and an 86-yard return on the opening kickoff vs. WAS (11/4). He finished fourth in the NFL at 27.5 per kickoff return, returning five kicks for 49-or-more yards.
- The second-year man from Florida State pulled off a 33-yard punt return in overtime to set up Mike Nugent's game-winning 38-yard field goal vs. PIT (11/18).

- He scored three rushing touchdowns, including two at MIA (12/2). He took a direct snap 18 yards in the first quarter and capped the scoring with a 12-yard run late in the fourth.
- He led the Jets with 57 yards rushing on four carries at NE (12/16), including a 49-yard run, the longest by a Jet in two years (Curtis Martin, 49, at BUF, 10/16/05).
- He accumulated 353 yards rushing (71 carries, 5.0), 213 yards receiving (36 receptions, 5.9), 1,291 yards on kick returns and 183 yards on punt returns (9.2).

Quarterbacks

#9 Erik Ainge

Fifth-round pick in 2008 out of Tennessee, threw for 8,700 yards and 72 touchdowns in college.

#11 Kellen Clemens

In his third year, he started eight games in 2007, throwing for 1,529 yards and five touchdowns.

#10 Chad Pennington

Entering his ninth season, he is the NFL's all-time leader in completion percentage (1,259-of-1,919, 65.6 percent) and has thrown 82 touchdown passes. He threw for a team-leading 1,765 yards and 10 touchdowns in nine games (eight starts) in 2007.

#5 Brett Ratliff

Spent 2007 season on the practice squad. He threw for 2,796 yards and 23 touchdowns at Utah.

Running Backs

#39 Jehuu Caulcrick

Rookie free agent out of Michigan State who rushed for 2,336 yards and 39 touchdowns for the Spartans.

#22 Jesse Chatman

Signed as an unrestricted free agent on March 11, the five-year veteran rushed for a career-high 515 yards for the Dolphins in 2007.

#20 Thomas Jones

Registered 1,119 yards rushing (10th in the NFL) on 310 carries (fifth in the NFL) in 2007, the third consecutive 1,000-yard season in his eight-year career.

#23 Rodney Kinlaw

Undrafted free agent from Penn State signed Aug. 1, he compiled 1,655 yards and 12 touchdowns on 323 carries in 45 career games.

#49 Tony Richardson

In his 14th year in the NFL, has played in 186 games, blocking for six 1,000 yard rushers (Adrian Peterson – 2007, Chester Taylor – 2006, Larry Johnson – 2005, Priest Holmes – 2001, 02, 03), helping them qualify for five Pro Bowls and earning three Pro Bowl berths himself.

#32 Musa Smith

Signed as a free agent, May 27, played five years in Baltimore, gaining 496 yards and four touchdowns.

#29 Leon Washington

In his third year in the NFL, he was the 2007 team MVP, returning three kicks for touchdowns, scoring three touchdowns rushing and tying for the team lead with Laveranues Coles with six total touchdowns.

Wide Receivers

#18 David Ball

Signed to active roster for the final game in 2007 but

was inactive. Broke Jerry Rice's Division I-AA record for touchdown receptions, catching 58 for New Hampshire.

#17 David Clowney

Signed by the Jets, Oct. 2007, released after three games and signed to the practice squad. Originally drafted by Green Bay in the fifth round in 2007.

#87 Laveranues Coles

In his ninth year in the NFL and seventh with the Jets, Coles has 567 career receptions, 67th all-time; 7,245 receiving yards, 96th all-time and 37 touchdowns. He led the team with six touchdown catches in 2007.

#89 Jerricho Cotchery

In his fifth year in the NFL, he has caught 82 passes in each of the past two seasons, logging a team-leading 1,130 yards in 2007.

#14 Marcus Henry

Sixth-round pick in the 2008 draft, he finished his career at Kansas with 104 catches for 1,598 yards and 13 touchdowns.

#2 Paul Raymond

A rookie free agent out of Brown, he totaled 1,800 yards on 116 receptions as a second-team All-Ivy League receiver.

#16 Brad Smith

Jets Head Coach Eric Mangini *3rd year with the Jets*

After he was named the 14th full-time head coach of the New York Jets on January 17, 2006, Eric Mangini led the Jets to a 10-6 record and a trip to the AFC Wild Card Game. Mangini's Jets used an innovative, multiple-formation offense that emphasized the strengths of quarterback Chad Pennington, who established career-highs while starting every game for the first time in his career. The defense morphed each week depending on the opponent. Mangini's efforts were recognized when he was named AFC Coach of the Year by the Kansas City Committee of 101.

Mangini is in his second stint with the Jets, having previously served on Bill Parcells' staff from 1997-1999, where he worked primarily as the defensive assistant/quality control coach responsible for advance opponent film breakdowns and analysis. Between his stints with the Jets, Mangini spent six seasons with the New England Patriots under head coach Bill Belichick. He was the defensive backs' coach for five years before he was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 2005 season.

Mangini played nose tackle and earned four letters (1989-90, '92-93) at Wesleyan University in Middletown, CT. He began his NFL career as a ballboy with the Cleveland Browns in 1994. He then moved into an intern position in the Browns' public relations department where his efforts were noticed by then-Cleveland head coach Belichick, who offered Mangini a position on his Browns' coaching staff in 1995. When the Browns relocated to Baltimore in 1996, Mangini moved with the franchise and joined Ted Marchibroda's staff.

Mangini was born on January 19, 1971, in Hartford, CT. He hosts a one-day Football Fundamentals mini-camp in Hartford each year giving athletes in grades 8-12 a chance to be taught by some of the NFL's top players and coaches. Proceeds from the camp benefit The Carmine and Frank Mangini (CFM) Foundation.

Browns Head Coach Romeo Crennel *4th year with the Browns*

Romeo Crennel was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns on Feb. 8, 2005, the 11th full-time head coach in team history. Crennel led the Browns to a 10-6 record in 2007, including a franchise-best seven consecutive home wins, and witnessed six Browns selected to the Pro Bowl. Crennel led the Browns to a 6-10 record in 2005 and posted a 4-12 mark in 2006. His resumé includes 38 years of coaching experience, including 26 years in the NFL, and has appeared in six Super Bowls, including five Super Bowl rings.

Crennel crafted the defense for the New England Patriots and helped them win three Super Bowl's (2001, 2003-04). In 2003, he was recognized by the Pro Football Writers of America as the NFL's Assistant Coach of the Year. Crennel had previously coached in the NFL with Cleveland (2000), the Jets (1997-99), New England (1993-96) and the Giants (1981-1992), where he was the defensive line coach for the Giants' Super Bowl XXV title.

Crennel was a four-year starter (1966-69) as a defensive lineman at Western Kentucky. He earned team MVP honors as a senior and received his bachelor's degree in physical education and then his master's degree while serving as a graduate assistant. Crennel coached collegiately at Western Kentucky (1970-74), Texas Tech (1975-77), Mississippi (1978-79) and Georgia Tech (1980).

He was born June 18, 1947 in Lynchburg, Va. He and his wife, Rosemary, have three daughters, Lisa Tulley, Tiffany Crennel and Kristin Cullinane.

New Coaches:

Bill Callahan – Asst. Head Coach/Offensive Line

Callahan joined the Jets after leading the Nebraska Cornhuskers to a 27-22 record and two Bowl appearances in four seasons. Prior to assuming the head coaching duties in Lincoln, NE, Callahan served as the head coach for the Oakland Raiders for two seasons (2002-03), logging a 15-17 regular season record and a 2-1 postseason mark. In his first season as a head coach on any level, Callahan led the Raiders to an 11-5 record, an AFC West title and a berth in Super Bowl XXXVII. He has also coached with the Eagles in the NFL, and in college with Wisconsin, Southern Illinois, Northern Arizona and Illinois.

New Veterans:

Ahmad Carroll, DB

Appeared in 35 regular-season games, with 28 starts, recording 104 tackles, 17 passes defended, three sacks and three interceptions. He spent the 2008 Arena Football League season with the Orlando Predators, recording 68 total tackles (60 solo).

Jesse Chatman, RB

Recorded two 100-yard rushing games in his career, for San Diego vs. Jacksonville (10/10/04) and for Miami vs. Buffalo (11/11/07). Last year he finished second on the Dolphins with a career-high 515 yards rushing on 128 attempts in 14 games, starting six.

Alan Faneca, G

A veteran of 158 games in his career, starting 153, including the last 96 consecutively, all for the Steelers. He appeared as a starter in seven consecutive Pro Bowls and has been selected six times as an Associated Press All-Pro.

Bubba Franks, TE

Amassed 256 receptions for 32 touchdowns and 2,300 yards (9.0 yards per catch) in 114 regular season games in his eight-year stay with GB. Appearing at the Pro Bowl three times, he ranks second all-time in GB history in receptions and touchdowns among tight ends.

Kris Jenkins, DT

In 85 games with 79 starts in seven years at Carolina, he posted 290 tackles, 20.5 sacks, 10 pass breakups, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and three blocked kicks. In four postseason games during the Panthers 2003 Super Bowl run, he recorded nine tackles, a sack and a pass breakup.

Kevin O’Dea – Special Teams Coordinator

O’Dea joined the Jets after spending two seasons as the Chicago Bears assistant special teams coach where he helped the Bears lead the NFL in overall special teams rankings (according to the *Dallas Morning News* ranking system) in each of his two seasons. It marked just the second time a team had the top-ranked special teams unit in consecutive years since the ranking system was created in 1990 (Buffalo, 2004 and 2005). He joined Chicago after spending the previous two seasons as the special teams coach of the Arizona Cardinals. O’Dea has also coached with Detroit, Tampa Bay and San Diego in the NFL and in college at Penn State, Virginia, Cornell and Lock Haven.

Calvin Pace, OLB

Played in 67 games (38 starts) in five seasons for Arizona, logging 186 tackles, 14 sacks, one interception, four fumbles forced and four fumble recoveries. In 2007 he started every game at linebacker, recording 6.5 sacks, 106 tackles and an interception.

Tony Richardson, FB

A 14-year NFL veteran, he has played in 186 regular season games, starting 106, rushing for 1,601 yards and 15 touchdowns on 407 carries while blocking for six 1,000-yard rushers. In 2007, he earned his third Pro Bowl berth and was recognized as an Associated Press All-Pro second-team honoree at fullback.

A.J. Schable, TE

Appeared in 11 games at defensive end, fullback and special teams for Arizona, totaling 12 special teams tackles and one rush for five yards.

Musa Smith, RB

He played in 49 games for Baltimore, gaining 496 yards on 132 carries with four touchdowns. He caught 54 passes for 363 yards and returned six kickoffs for 133 yards.

Damien Woody, RT

Going into his 10th year in the league, he has played for two Super Bowl championship teams for New England (2001 and 2003). He has played in 128 regular season games in his career, starting 121, in addition to four postseason starts.

Cameron Worrell, S

Entering his sixth year in the NFL, he appeared in 55 games for the Bears and Dolphins with seven starts, totaling 70 tackles, two sacks, one pass defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Last year with Miami he recorded 50 tackles and six special teams tackles.
