HEADLINES

- Jets Head Coach **Rex Ryan**, defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** and Jets defensive starters **Bart Scott**, **Jim Leonhard** and **Marques Douglas** return to their 2008 home field as they play against the Ravens at M&T Bank Field on a preseason broadcast of Monday Night Football.
- **Mark Sanchez**, the Jets fifth overall pick in the 2009 NFL Draft, gets the starting nod at quarterback for the first time.
- For the second straight preseason, **David Clowney** had a big opening night. Against STL, he caught three passes for 102 yards, including a 50-yard scoring pass from **Erik Ainge** and a 48 yarder from Sanchez on the QB's first play from scrimmage. In 2008 at CLE, Clowney had four catches for 163 yards, including two touchdown throws (71, 70) from former Jet **Brett Ratliff**.

2008 TEAM NOTES

- The Jets led the NFL with seven Pro Bowl players: **OL Alan Faneca**, **NT Kris Jenkins**, **RB Thomas Jones**, **KR Leon Washington** were named starters, while **C Nick Mangold**, **CB Darrelle Revis** and former Jets **QB Brett Favre**, were named reserves.
- The Jets scored 405 total points in 2008, the third-highest total in team history, trailing only the 1968 team (419 in 14 games) and the 1998 team (416 in 16 games).
- The 48 touchdowns ranks second in team history, trailing only the 51 scored in 1960, the inaugural year of the franchise.
- The Jets 2008 Curtis Martin Team MVP **Thomas Jones** established a new Jets record for total touchdowns with 15 and rushing touchdowns with 13.
- Thomas Jones** led the AFC and finished fifth in the NFL with 1,312 rushing yards (290 carries, 4.5 avg., 13 TD).
- Leon Washington's** 2,332 combined yards led the NFL and set a new Jets single-season record.
- Dustin Keller's** 48 receptions were the most ever by a Jets rookie tight end and the fourth-highest total by a rookie in franchise history.

SPOTLIGHTING THE O-LINE

The 2008 Jets were the first team to start four first-round draft picks on the offensive line since the 2002 Steelers (**Alan Faneca**, **Wayne Gandy**, **Jeff Hartings** and **Kendall Simmons**). The Jets project the same starting offensive line in 2009 under Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line **Bill Callahan**, a first for the Jets since the 2000 and 2001.

- The Jets scored 25.9 points per game in 2008, tied for fifth in the NFL, which included a franchise-record 115 points in a three-game Nov. stretch (vs. STL, at NE, at TEN).
- The 2008 Jets were ninth in the NFL in rushing (128.3 yards per game) and third at 4.8 yards per carry.
- Thomas Jones** led the AFC in rushing in 2008 with 1,312 yards and set franchise records with 15 touchdowns and 13 rushing touchdowns.
- The Jets allowed 30 sacks in 2008, down from 51 sacks in 2007.
- The Jets rushed for 4.8 yards per carry and scored 19 rushing touchdowns in 2008, compared to 3.8 yards per carry and six rushing touchdowns in 2007.
- The 2008 Jets led the NFL in ball control with 30 five-minute drives and 15 touchdowns on five-minute drives.

2008 MVP THOMAS JONES

- Jones was voted the **Curtis Martin Team MVP** and **Dennis Byrd Most Inspirational Player** by his teammates.
- Jones led the AFC and finished fifth in the NFL in 2008 with 1,312 yards on 290 carries (4.5), and led the team with a career-best and franchise-record 15 touchdowns, including a team-record 13 rushing touchdowns.
- Jones scored a touchdown in eight consecutive games (Weeks 8-15) in 2008, the new franchise record.
- The 1,312 rushing yards marked the 14th time a Jets running back has rushed for over 1,000 yards in a season.
- Recorded first career three-touchdown game vs. CIN, 10/12/08, scoring on two runs (7, 1) and a two-yard reception.
- Logged his second-highest rushing total of his career, 159 yards (6.6 avg.) at OAK, 10/19/08.
- Posted 149 rushing yards and three touchdowns vs. STL, 11/9/08, his fourth-highest rushing total of his career.

2009 PRESEASON OPENER

- In the first look at both quarterbacks competing for the Jets starting job, **Kellen Clemens** was 4-for-4 for 24 yards in two drives, leading the Jets to a field goal. **Mark Sanchez** was 3-for-4 for 88 yards in one drive, leading the Jets to a touchdown.
- Erik Ainge** finished 10-for-17 for 178 yards and one touchdown, a 50-yard pass to **David Clowney**. Clowney led the way with three catches for 102 yards and the touchdown. He also pulled in a 48-yarder from Sanchez on the rookie quarterback's first play from scrimmage.
- The new-look Jets defense registered four sacks, one each by **David Harris**, **Calvin Pace**, **Donald Strickland** and **Kenwin Cummings**.

PRESEASON TO POSTSEASON

In the Jets 12 playoff seasons, the team has posted winning preseason records on five occasions. The team has produced a .500 record three times and had a losing preseason mark four times.

Rex Ryan was named the 15th full-time head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2009.

For Rex, it is a sort of homecoming, returning to the franchise he first experienced in 1968 when his father, Buddy, was hired as the defensive line coach under Weeb Ewbank. That season culminated in the Jets' Super Bowl III victory in Miami with a six-year-old Rex Ryan watching from the stands in the Orange Bowl.

Ryan spent the last 10 seasons with the Baltimore Ravens, including 2008 as assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. During Ryan's tenure, the Ravens defense never ranked lower than sixth in the NFL. From 1999-2008, the Ravens ranked first for fewest points allowed (17.1 per game), fewest rushing yards allowed per game (87.3), most shutouts (9), most take-aways (337), most interceptions (212), most interceptions for touchdowns (29) and third-down conversion defense (33.9 percent).

Ryan began his Ravens career as the defensive line coach for Brian Billick in 1999, when the Ravens defense finished second in the NFL in total defense and second against the run. In 2000, the Ravens defense allowed the fewest points in a 16-game season in NFL history (165) en route to winning Super Bowl XXXV.

Ryan was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2005. During his four seasons in that role, the Ravens defense finished fifth (2005), first (2006), sixth (2007) and second (2008) in the NFL. In 2006, the defense allowed only 201 points and 264 yards per game as Ryan was named NFL Assistant Coach of the Year by Pro Football Weekly and the Pro Football Writers Association.

In 2008, new Head Coach John Harbaugh named Ryan assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. The Ravens 2008 defense allowed 261.1 yards per game, marking the fourth time since 1999 the Ravens finished second overall in the NFL. Before joining the Ravens, Ryan was a defensive coordinator in college at Oklahoma (1998) and Cincinnati (1996-97). His first NFL coaching stint was with the Arizona Cardinals under his father, when he oversaw the defensive line in 1994 and linebackers in 1995. Ryan has also coached at Morehead State (1990-93), New Mexico Highlands (1989) and Eastern Kentucky (1987-88).

Ryan, 46, graduated from Stevenson High School in Prairie View, IL, and played football at SW Oklahoma State. He earned his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Physical Education at Eastern Kentucky in 1988.

Ryan was born in Ardmore, OK. He and his wife, Michelle, have two sons, Payton, named for Walter Payton, and Seth.

John Harbaugh became the third head coach in Baltimore Ravens history on January 19, 2008. In his first season in Baltimore, Harbaugh led the Ravens to an 11-5 record and a berth in the AFC Championship game. Baltimore set an NFL record for most wins by a team with both a rookie head coach and a rookie quarterback (Joe Flacco). Harbaugh spent the previous 10 seasons (1998-2007) with the Philadelphia Eagles. He was the team's secondary coach in 2007, after nine seasons as its special teams coordinator. Under his leadership, Harbaugh's special teams units were consistently ranked among the NFL's best. From 2000-04, Philadelphia was the only team to rank in the top 10 in the comprehensive annual special teams report created by The Dallas Morning News' Rick Gosselin. (Gosselin's report is recognized by NFL teams as the special teams measuring stick.) In 2001 and 2003, the Eagles were ranked first by Gosselin, who compiles his report based on 22 kicking-game categories. Following the 2001 season, Harbaugh was voted the NFL's Special Teams Coach of the Year by his coaching peers. He was also named The Dallas Morning News Special Teams Coach of the Year that season.

Harbaugh played defensive back for four years at Miami (Ohio) from 1980-83, while earning his degree in political science. He coached on the collegiate level at Western Michigan (1984-86), Pittsburgh (1987), Morehead State (1988), Cincinnati (1989-1996), and Indiana (1997).

Born in Perrysburg, Ohio on September 23, 1962, Harbaugh and his wife, Ingrid, have a daughter, Alison. He is the son of longtime college coach Jack Harbaugh, and his brother, Jim, the current Stanford head coach, played quarterback in the NFL for 14 years, including a season in Baltimore (1998). John's brother-in-law, Tom Crean, Indiana University's head basketball coach, is married to his sister, Joani.



JETS COACHES WITH TIES TO BALTIMORE

Head Coach **Rex Ryan** spent the last 10 seasons with Baltimore during which time he was assistant head coach/defensive coordinator (2008), defensive coordinator (2005-07) and defensive line coach (1999-04)...Defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** coached for the Ravens for the last seven years...Pettine was the outside linebackers coach (2005-08), defensive assistant (2004), coaching assistant/quality control (2003) and coaching and video assistant (2002)...Quarterbacks coach **Matt Cavanaugh** was the offensive coordinator for the Ravens from 1999-04...Defensive backs coach **Dennis Thurman** was the secondary coach for Baltimore from 2004-07 and the defensive assistant from 2002-03.

WR coach **Jim Hostler** spent two seasons with the NY Jets (2003-04) as the quarterbacks coach and then the wide receivers coach...Offensive assistant **Craig Ver Steeg** was the offensive coordinator for Rutgers University from 2003-06 and running backs coach in 2007.

Fourth-year man **Kellen Clemens** and 2009 first-round pick **Mark Sanchez** are competing to be the starter Week 1 at HOU.

#10 Erik Ainge

Second-year player from Tennessee made the 53-man roster as the fourth quarterback in 2008 and was inactive for the first seven games before being placed injured reserve, 10/29. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Was 10-for-17 for 178 yards and a touchdown, a 50-yard strike to David Clowney.

#11 Kellen Clemens

The fourth-year man was the backup behind Brett Favre in 2008, seeing action in two games, and was three-for-five passing for 26 yards and an interception. Started eight games in 2007 with a record of 3-5, throwing for 1,555 yards, five touchdowns and 10 interceptions. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Was 4-for-4 for 24 yards in two series, leading the team to one field goal.

#6 Mark Sanchez

Selected fifth overall in the 2009 NFL Draft and signed, 6/10, the USC product threw for 3,965 yards, 41 touchdowns and 16 interceptions, completing over 64 percent of his passes for the Trojans. He posted a record of 14-2 as a starter. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Hit 3-of-4 passes for 88 yards in one series, leading the team to a touchdown on an eight-play, 93-yard drive, which began with a 48-yard pass to David Clowney.

Running Backs (7)

The Jets feature a trio of veterans who have been to the Pro Bowl in **Thomas Jones**, **Leon Washington** and **Tony Richardson** and have added 2009 third-round choice **Shonn Greene** to the mix.

#39 Jehuu Caulcrick

Spent 2008 on the Jets practice squad after attending training camp. The four-year letterman at Michigan State rushed for 2,336 career yards (39 touchdowns, 517 attempts, 4.5 avg.).

#32 Brock Christopher

First signed with the Falcons as an undrafted free agent in April 2009 before signing with the Jets, 6/15. Played linebacker in college, starting 36 games at Missouri, registering 319 tackles, including 105 as a senior.

#23 Shonn Greene

Selected by the Jets with the first pick of the third round, No. 65 overall in the 2009 NFL Draft. In 33 games at Iowa, he started 13 games, rushing for 2,228 yards and 22 touchdowns. Set the school record with 1,850 yards rushing and 20 touchdowns in 2008, becoming Iowa's first consensus All-American running back since Nile Kinnick in 1939 and earned the Doak Walker Award. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Ripped off a 34-yard run and led the Jets with 45 yards rushing on nine carries.

#20 Thomas Jones

Voted to his first Pro Bowl when he led the AFC with 1,312 yards rushing in 2008. His 15 touchdowns, including 13 on the ground, and eight consecutive games with a touchdown are all franchise records. Ranks 42nd all-time with 7,815 career rushing yards (49th back to surpass 7,000 yards) on 1,949 carries (4.0) with 48 rushing touchdowns. Logged 1,800 career receiving yards on 279 catches (6.5) with three receiving touchdowns, all three coming with the Jets. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Posted nine carries for 13 yards.

#49 Tony Richardson

Chosen as a third alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008, starting seven times at fullback, with 10 carries for 65 yards and caught one pass for four yards. Played in 202 regular season games, starting 113, earning three Pro Bowl berths. Has blocked for seven 1,000-yard rushing seasons in his career (Thomas Jones, Adrian Peterson, Chester Taylor, Larry Johnson and Priest Holmes- 3). **Did Not Dress vs. STL, 8/14 (hip).**

#29 Leon Washington

Voted to his first Pro Bowl as the AFC returner in 2008. Led the NFL in combined yards with 2,332 and scored nine touchdowns, averaging 25.6 yards per kick return (1,231 yards, 92-yard kick return for a touchdown at NE, 11/13/08) and 10.4 per punt return (303 yards). Also totaled 448 yards rushing (including touchdown runs of 11, 60, 61, 4, 47, and 10 yards) and 47 receptions for 355 yards receiving and two touchdowns. Ranks fourth in kickoff return yardage in Jets history with 2,601 on 101 returns (25.8)...Averages 9.4 yards per punt return on 29 returns...Rushed for 1,451 yards and 13 touchdowns in his career, has caught 108 passes for 838 yards and two scores and is one-for-one passing for 36 yards. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Logged a 24-yard kickoff return and nine yards rushing.

#22 Danny Woodhead

Signed with the Jets as an undrafted free agent in 2008 and spent the season on injured reserve. At Chadron State in Nebraska, he won two consecutive Harlon Hill Trophies, honoring the best player in Division II. Rushed for 7,962 yards, the most in NCAA history at the time, and his 9,749 all-purpose yards stands second all-time. He scored in 38 straight games and is second all-time in scoring with 654 points, and his 109 career touchdowns tied the all-time record. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Registered two kickoff returns for 45 yards and five yards rushing.

Wide Receivers (9)

Starter **Jerricho Cotchery** leads a group featuring returning veterans **Chansi Stuckey**, **Brad Smith**, **David Clowney** and **Wallace Wright**, all who saw action for the Jets in 2008, are competing to start opposite Cotchery.

Set a Vikings record with the longest play in team history, a 104-yard kickoff return touchdown vs. DET (12/2/07).

#87 David Clowney

Recorded his only career reception, for 26 yards, vs. BUF, 12/14/08, in his NFL debut. He appeared in two games in 2008. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Recorded three catches for 102 yards and a touchdown to lead the Jets, hauling in a 48-yarder from Mark Sanchez and a 50-yard touchdown from Erik Ainge.

#89 Jerricho Cotchery

Led team with 71 grabs for 858 yards and five scores in 2008. In 75 career games, starting 48, has registered 260 receptions (three consecutive 70-plus catch seasons) for 3,260 yards and 13 touchdowns, 13 rushes for 75 yards, 22 kickoff returns for 577 yards with one touchdown, 23 punt returns for 182 yards and 29 special teams tackles. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Grabbed one reception for nine yards.

#17 Britt Davis

Signed as a rookie free agent out of Northern Illinois, he finished his collegiate career fifth on the NIU all-time charts with 146 catches and totaled 1,676 receiving yards, 2,063 all-purpose yards and nine touchdowns. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Recorded two receptions for 33 yards.

#14 Marcus Henry

Made 53-man roster in 2008 before he was waived, 9/22/08. Signed to practice squad, 9/24/08, where he spent the remainder of the season. Logged 104 catches for 1,598 receiving yards (15.4) and 13 touchdowns in 46 games at Kansas.

#16 Brad Smith

In three seasons, played in 47 games, starting 13 as both a wide receiver (11) and running back (two). He has also lined up at quarterback. His career totals include 53 receptions for 450 yards and two touchdowns and 42 rushes for 261 yards. Also is one-of-three passing for 18 yards, has 14 kickoff returns for 226 yards and 39 special teams tackles. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Ran 28 yards on a reverse to set up a field goal and added a 10-yard reception.

#83 Chansi Stuckey

After spending his rookie season in 2007 on injured reserve, posted three touchdowns on 32 receptions for 359 yards in 2008. Was the first Jets player to score a touchdown in his NFL debut since 1987, hauling in a 22-yard touchdown reception at MIA, 9/7/08. Also was the first NFL player since 2002 to catch a touchdown pass in each of his first three games. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Posted a five-yard catch.

#18 Huey Whittaker

Waived 8/11 and re-signed 8/15. Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2004 with PIT, also spent time on the practice squads of TB and JAC. Played portions of the last three seasons for Tampa and Utah in the Arena Football League, logging 126 receptions for 1,541 yards and 40 touchdowns for Utah in 2008 where he was first-team All-Arena League.

#15 Wallace Wright

Played in 37 games over four seasons, starting one at wide receiver. Has recorded six catches for 87 yards and two kickoff returns for 31 yards. Also logged 48 special teams tackles, including 26 in 2008 which tied for the team lead. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Recorded three catches for 31 yards.

Tight Ends (4)

Second-year man **Dustin Keller** leads a young group. Converted defensive end **Kareem Brown**, rookie free agent **Jack Simmons** and waiver claim **Kevin Brock** are all competing for roster spots.

#86 Kevin Brock

Claimed by the Jets off waivers from CAR, Aug. 3. Went to Rutgers as a wide receiver but converted to tight end as a freshman. Used as a blocker first two years but had 49 receptions for 541 yards and three touchdowns in final two seasons.

#84 Kareem Brown

Originally drafted by NE in the fourth round in 2007 and was claimed off waivers by the Jets, 11/28/07. Made his NFL debut Week 17 vs. KC, 12/30/07 on special teams. Transitioned from defensive end to tight end in Spring 2009. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Logged two receptions for 20 yards.

#81 Dustin Keller

Drafted after the Jets traded up for the 30th pick in the first round in 2008. Ranked second in the NFL in 2008 among rookie tight ends in receptions with 48 receptions for 535 yards (11.1 avg.) and three touchdowns. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Started and recorded three catches for 52 yards, including two catches for 40 yards from Mark Sanchez on a touchdown drive.

#46 Jack Simmons

Signed as an undrafted free agent after earning a contract in the Jets tryout camp after the 2009 NFL Draft. Was a three-year starter, appearing in 41 games at Minnesota. Finished with 73 career receptions for 762 yards and three touchdowns.

Offensive Line (15)

All seven linemen from last year's roster return, including all five starters, who each started 16 games in 2008. Sixth-round pick **Matt Slauson** has been added to the group.

#71 Dennis Conley

Signed by the Jets Aug. 15, he was waived by CHI on July 31 after being signed as an undrafted free agent on April 26, 2009. A two-time All-MEAC choice from Hampton, Conley played in 37 games, starting 30, as a left guard.

#76 Michael Kracalik

Originally signed by the Jets as an undrafted free agent in 2005, he played in four NFL games for Ravens over three seasons (2006-08).

#74 Nick Mangold

Voted to his first Pro Bowl in 2008. The 29th overall pick in '06 from Ohio State has started 48 straight regular season games at center. He was the first center in Jets history to start every regular season game as a rookie in 2006. **Did Not Dress (knee) vs. STL, 8/14.**

#72 Nevin McCaskill

The Hampton University product spent most of the 2007 season on the BUF practice squad and also spent time on the GB active roster in 2008, but was inactive for four games.

#69 Ryan McKee

Signed as an undrafted free agent in May, he started three consecutive seasons at right tackle for Southern Miss as the team surpassed the school's record for total offense each season.

#65 Brandon Moore

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent defensive lineman out of Illinois in 2002, he converted to offense in 2003 and has started 73 consecutive regular season games at right guard.

#56 Michael Parenton

Signed as an undrafted free agent in May, he started 46 games for Tulane, spending 2008 at center after playing left guard as a junior, center as a sophomore and right guard as a freshman.

#68 Matt Slauson

Selected by the Jets with the 193rd overall pick in the sixth round from Nebraska, played three different positions in college, starting all 13 games at right guard as a senior in 2008.

#62 Tavita Thompson

Signed as an undrafted free agent in May, started at left tackle as a junior and right tackle as a senior at Oregon State. Played mostly defensive line in high school.

#75 Robert Turner

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent, 5/16/07, has played guard, center and as an extra tight end in 12 career games, including 10 in 2008.

#67 Damien Woody

Started every game at right tackle in 2008 after signing as unrestricted free agent in 2008. Played in 144 games, making 137 starts. Previously played four seasons for DET as a guard and tackle and his first six seasons as a center in NE, including a Pro Bowl season in 2002. Entered the league in 1999 as the 17th overall pick from Boston College. **Did Not Dress (head) vs. STL, 8/14.**

Defensive Line (10)

New addition **Marques Douglas** joins starters **Kris Jenkins** and **Shaun Ellis** on this group that helped the Jets rank seventh in rushing yards allowed per game.

#70 Mike DeVito

Has appeared in 23 games as a reserve defensive end after signing as an undrafted free agent in May 2007. Had 28 tackles, 0.5 sacks, two pressures and two tackles-for-loss in 2008.

#93 Marques Douglas

Signed as a free agent in March 2009, logged 104 games played, 79 starts, 480 tackles, 19 sacks (16.5 yards), 11 deflected passes, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. His 41.5 tackles-for-loss from 2003-08 are the third-most in the NFL (Pat Williams 49.0, Lance Briggs 44.5). Has not missed a game in six seasons (96 games) and posted a career-high 100 tackles in 2007.

#92 Shaun Ellis

Chosen as second alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008, leading the Jets with eight sacks and 12 pressures, also logging 66 tackles, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery that he returned for the first touchdown of his career. In nine seasons, played in 140 games, third all-time among Jets DL, recording 61.5 sacks (fourth all-time on Jets) and 566 career tackles.

#95 Howard Green

Originally drafted 190th overall in the sixth round by HOU in 2002, has played in 37 games, starting 12 with BAL, NO and SEA in parts of five seasons. Had recorded 87 tackles, one pass deflected, one sack and a forced fumble.

#79 Ropati Pitoitua

Signed as an undrafted free agent in May 2008 and spent most of the season on the practice squad. At Washington State, played in 36 games, starting 25, posting 116 tackles, 19 tackles-for-loss and 8.5 sacks in four seasons. Vs. STL, 8/14: Recorded a deflected pass.

#91 Sione Pouha

Father, Dean, was the 1983 Lombardi Trophy and Outland Trophy winner as an offensive lineman who also played for Nebraska and has his No. 71 jersey retired. Linebackers (13)

Veteran **Bryan Thomas** and **Calvin Pace** anchor the outside, while third-year man **David Harris** and new addition **Bart Scott** anchor the inside.

#54 Kenwin Cummings

Signed as an undrafted free agent in May 2008 and made the 53-man roster. Was declared inactive for opener before he was waived, 9/10/08 and signed to practice squad, 9/15/08, where he spent the remainder of the season. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Recorded a sack.

#50 Vernon Gholston

Played in 15 games after being drafted sixth overall in the 2008 NFL Draft after setting a single-season record at Ohio State with 14 sacks in 2007. Had 12 tackles on special teams and five tackles plus one pressure on defense.

#52 David Harris

Played in 27 games, starting 20 in two seasons since he was drafted 47th overall in the second round in 2007. Led the team in tackles as a rookie with 117, and added five sacks in 2007, and registered 87 tackles and one sack in 11 games in 2008. He missed five games with a groin injury in 2008. Signed Aug. 16 as an undrafted free agent, he was a four-year starter at linebacker Nevada. In his senior year, totaled 54 tackles, 7.5 for loss and 3.5 sacks.

#94 Marques Murrell

Played in 12 games in 2008, making 10 tackles and forcing a fumble on special teams. While with PHI, produced two sacks and two forced fumbles vs. the Jets during the preseason finale at PHI, 8/30/07.

#97 Calvin Pace

Chosen as the third alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008 while establishing career highs in sacks, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries. He posted 67 tackles, a team-leading 12 tackles-for-loss, 7.0 sacks, nine pressures, three passes defensed, five forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries, including a 50-yard return for a touchdown. He was originally drafted by ARI 18th overall in 2003. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Recorded a sack.

#47 Brandon Renkart

Spent most of 2008 on the Jets practice squad after he signed in July. Originally a walk-on at Rutgers, recorded six sacks over his final two seasons with 18 tackles-for-loss. In his junior season, first as a linebacker, he ranked sixth on the team with 54 tackles (25 solo), 3.5 sacks, 11.5 stops for losses and two pressures in 13 starts.

Signed with the Jets as an undrafted free agent in 2009. Three-year starter at Rutgers finished with 26 sacks, third highest in school history, in 50 career games, and totaled 141 tackles, including 45 behind the line of scrimmage.

Defensive Backs (13)

Highlighted by a pair of cornerbacks that were drafted in the first round and have earned Pro Bowl recognition, **Darrelle Revis** and new acquisition **Lito Sheppard** will start alongside safeties **Kerry Rhodes** and newcomer **Jim Leonhard**.

#35 Rashad Barksdale

Claimed off waivers from NYG, June 25. Played in six games for KC in 2007, recording nine tackles. Originally drafted 201st overall (sixth round) of the 2007 Draft by PHI after playing at SUNY Albany, where he walked on in 2006. Started 10 games at Albany and recorded 37 tackles and three interceptions.

#31 Ahmad Carroll

Appeared in 51 games, starting 28 times over four seasons after being drafted 25th overall by GB in 2004. Has recorded 104 tackles, 24 passes defended, three sacks and three interceptions. Signed with the Jets in July 2008 and finished tied with Wallace Wright for first with 26 special teams tackles.

#34 Marquice Cole

Attended training camp with OAK in 2007 and TEN in 2008. Played in 43 games at Northwestern where he was named to the Thorpe Award preseason watch list. Totaled 114 tackles, seven interceptions and one sack in his career.

#30 Drew Coleman

Since being drafted 189th overall (sixth round) in 2006, has played 36 games in three seasons, starting four, recording 44 tackles, one interception, two sacks and a forced fumble. Has registered 16 tackles on special teams.

#38 Emanuel Cook

Signed as an undrafted free agent in May 2009. Led South Carolina in tackles the past two seasons. Totaled 179 tackles, five pass breakups, three interceptions and two forced fumbles.

#44 James Ihedigbo

Originally signed by the Jets in May 2007 and spent the season on Injured Reserve. Played in eight NFL games in 2008, recording 11 tackles on special teams.

#36 Jim Leonhard

A veteran of 54 NFL games with 20 starts, recorded 144 tackles, one sack, three interceptions, nine passes defended and one touchdown. Signed by the Jets in March 2009 after spending 2008 with BAL. Originally signed by BUF in 2005 as an undrafted free agent. Also recorded 19 special teams tackles, 326 yards on 31 punt returns (10.5 avg.) and 249 yards on 11 kick-off returns (22.6 avg.).

#21 Dwight Lowery

Played in all 16 games, starting the first 10 in his rookie season with 58 tackles, one interception, five forced fumbles and 17 passes defended after being selected 114th overall (fourth round) in 2008.

#24 Darrelle Revis

Started all 32 games in his career after being drafted 14th overall in 2007, and has recorded 150 tackles, one sack, eight interceptions, one touchdown, 28 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Earned his first Pro Bowl selection in 2008 after finishing the season with 59 tackles, five interceptions, 15 passes defended, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, as well as his first career sack and first career interception return for touchdown. **Did Not Dress (ham-string) vs. STL, 8/14.**

#25 Kerry Rhodes

Chosen as the third alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008. Started 64 consecutive games to begin his NFL career. Selected 123rd overall (fourth round), recording 349 tackles, 12 interceptions, nine sacks, 30 passes defended, five forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries, including an 11-yard return for a touchdown. Led the Jets secondary in tackles in 2008 with 81.

Acquired by the Jets in Feb. 2009 in a trade with PHI. Two-time Pro Bowl selection (2005, 06) has recorded 256 tackles (199 solo), two sacks, 18 interceptions (three for touchdowns), 49 passes defended, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery while seeing action in 93 games with 61 starts after being selected with the 26th overall pick in 2002. Was the first player in NFL history to post two interceptions with returns of 100-or-more yards in his career (10/8/06 vs. DAL, QB Drew Bledsoe, 102 yards; 11/15/04 at DAL, QB Vinny Testaverde, 101 yards).

#33 Eric Smith

Played in 39 games, starting 10, in three seasons since being drafted 97th overall (third round) in 2006. Posted 84 tackles, three interceptions and one fumble recovered, along with 11 passes defended. In 2008, played in nine games, starting six, recording 32 tackles, one tackle-for-loss, four passes defended, one fumble recovery and an interception.

#27 Donald Strickland

Signed by the Jets in March 2009 as an unrestricted free agent. Played in 49 games, making 22 starts and recording 160 tackles, two interceptions, 16 passes defended, one forced fumble and 12 special teams tackles for IND, PHI and SF. Was originally drafted 90th overall (3rd round) by IND in 2003. Finished 2008 season with a career-high 44 tackles, six passes defended and seven special team tackles. Recorded a sack in the preseason opener vs. STL, 8/14.

Specialists (5)

Incumbent punter **Reggie Hodges** faces a challenge from new; y-signed **Kenneth Parrish**. **Jay Feely** is in his second season and first training camp as the Jets placekicker while snapper **James Dearth** has held that position since 2001. Kick returns will be handled by Pro Bowler **Leon Washington** while safety **Jim Leonhard** steps in as the lead punt returner.

#85 James Dearth

The Jets long-snapper since 2001 has appeared in 128 consecutive games. Has one special teams tackle.

#7 Parker Douglass

Picked up by the Jets Aug. 12, he originally signed as a free agent May 15, 2009 with CLE and was waived July 31. Prior to signing with the Browns, he played with the Sioux Falls Storm of the Indoor Football League (IFL), converting 15-of-27 field goals and 31-of-36 PAT. At South Dakota State, he broke or tied 19 kicking records.

#3 Jay Feely

Entering his ninth year, was signed by the Jets, 9/10/08. In 2008, hit 24-of-28 field goals, including his last 14 in a row, and was 39-for-39 on extra-point attempts for 111 points, the fifth 100-point season of his career. Hit a 55-yard FG, tying his career high and Jets franchise record, 11/9/08 vs. STL.

#5 Reggie Hodges

Played the final 12 games for the Jets after he was signed by 9/17/08, averaging 42.8 yards per punt gross/35.5 net on 44 punts, with 14 inside-the-20.

#9 Kenneth Parrish

Signed by the Jets, Aug. 16, after he was waived by PHI on Aug. 9. He originally entered the NFL when he was signed by SF as an undrafted free agent on May 4, 2007 but was waived, Aug. 27. A first-team All-PSAC East selection as a junior and senior at East Stroudsburg (PA), he averaged 40.3 yards per punt.
