HEADLINES

- Jets Head Coach **Rex Ryan** announced that the starters would play "about one series" vs. the Eagles, but said that some starters might see more action.
- Jets rookie starting quarterback **Mark Sanchez** has completed 19-of-32 passes (59.4 percent) for 280 yards and two touchdowns against one interception in the preseason for a 95.9 passer rating. Against the Giants, 8/29, in more than a half of action, Sanchez finished 13-for-20 for 149 yards and one touchdown, a 104.0 passer rating, leading the Jets to 20 points.
- Jets defense is tied for second in the NFL in sacks, registering 11 in three preseason games, led by **David Harris** and **Calvin Pace** with two apiece.
- **Leon Washington** leads the NFL in combined yards through three pre-season games with 381 yards (119 rush, 40 rec, 222 kick returns).

2008 TEAM NOTES

- The Jets led the NFL with seven Pro Bowl players: **OL Alan Faneca**, **NT Kris Jenkins**, **RB Thomas Jones**, **KR Leon Washington** were named starters, while **C Nick Mangold**, **CB Darrelle Revis** and former Jets **QB Brett Favre**, were named reserves.
- The Jets scored 405 total points in 2008, the third-highest total in team history, trailing only the 1968 team (419 in 14 games) and the 1998 team (416 in 16 games).
- The 48 touchdowns ranks second in team history, trailing only the 51 scored in 1960, the inaugural year of the franchise.
- The Jets 2008 Curtis Martin Team MVP **Thomas Jones** established a new Jets record for total touchdowns with 15 and rushing touchdowns with 13.
- Thomas Jones** led the AFC and finished fifth in the NFL with 1,312 rushing yards (290 carries, 4.5 avg., 13 TD).
- Leon Washington's** 2,332 combined yards led the NFL and set a new Jets single-season record.
- Dustin Keller's** 48 receptions were the most ever by a Jets rookie tight end and the fourth-highest total by a rookie in franchise history.

SPOTLIGHTING THE O-LINE

The 2008 Jets were the first team to start four first-round draft picks on the offensive line since the 2002 Steelers (**Alan Faneca**, **Wayne Gandy**, **Jeff Hartings** and **Kendall Simmons**). The Jets project the same starting offensive line in 2009 under Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line **Bill Callahan**, a first for the Jets since the 2000 and 2001.

- The Jets scored 25.9 points per game in 2008, tied for fifth in the NFL, which included a franchise-record 115 points in a three-game Nov. stretch (vs. STL, at NE, at TEN).
- The 2008 Jets were ninth in the NFL in rushing (128.3 yards per game) and third at 4.8 yards per carry.
- Thomas Jones** led the AFC in rushing in 2008 with 1,312 yards and set franchise records with 15 touchdowns and 13 rushing touchdowns.
- The Jets allowed 30 sacks in 2008, down from 51 sacks in 2007.
- The Jets rushed for 4.8 yards per carry and scored 19 rushing touchdowns in 2008, compared to 3.8 yards per carry and six rushing touchdowns in 2007.
- The 2008 Jets led the NFL in ball control with 30 five-minute drives and 15 touchdowns on five-minute drives.

2008 MVP THOMAS JONES

- Jones was voted the **Curtis Martin Team MVP** and **Dennis Byrd Most Inspirational Player** by his teammates.
- Jones led the AFC and finished fifth in the NFL in 2008 with 1,312 yards on 290 carries (4.5), and led the team with a career-best and franchise-record 15 touchdowns, including a team-record 13 rushing touchdowns.
- Jones scored a touchdown in eight consecutive games (Weeks 8-15) in 2008, the new franchise record.
- The 1,312 rushing yards marked the 14th time a Jets running back has rushed for over 1,000 yards in a season.
- Recorded first career three-touchdown game vs. CIN, 10/12/08, scoring on two runs (7, 1) and a two-yard reception.
- Logged his second-highest rushing total of his career, 159 yards (6.6 avg.) at OAK, 10/19/08.
- Posted 149 rushing yards and three touchdowns vs. STL, 11/9/08, his fourth-highest rushing total of his career.

2009 PRESEASON

Jets 27, Giants 25 (8/29/09 - Meadowlands)

- Rex Ryan** picks up his first win as a head coach as **Erik Ainge** hit **Aundrae Allison** with a 70-yard touchdown strike in the final four minutes to close the Jets scoring.
- Mark Sanchez** finished 13-for-20 for 149 yards and one touchdown, a 104.0 passer rating, leading the Jets to 20 points while playing into the third quarter.
- The Jets defense picked up three more sacks (**Jamaal Westerman**, **Ahmad Carroll** and **Jason Trusnik**), a **David Harris** interception and a forced fumble by **Bart Scott** in which he took the ball from **Brandon Jacobs** after losing his helmet.

Ravens 24, Jets 23 (8/24/09 - M&T Bank Stadium)

- Leon Washington** totaled 176 combined net yards (48 rush, 35 rec, 93 kickoff returns), highlighted by a 19-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.
- The Jets defense recorded four sacks (**David Harris**, **Calvin Pace**, **Howard Green** and **Ropati Pitoitua**).

Rams 23, Jets 20 (8/14/09 - Meadowlands)

- Kellen Clemens** was 4-for-4 for 24 yards in two drives, leading the Jets to a field goal. **Mark Sanchez** was 3-for-4 for 88 yards in one drive, leading the Jets to a touchdown.
- Erik Ainge** finished 10-for-17 for 178 yards and one touchdown, a 50-yard pass to **David Clowney**. Clowney led the way with three catches for 102 yards and the touchdown. He also pulled in a 48-yarder from Sanchez on the rookie quarterback's first play from scrimmage.
- The Jets defense registered four sacks, (**David Harris**, **Calvin Pace**, **Donald Strickland** and **Kenwin Cummings**).

PRESEASON TO POSTSEASON

In the Jets 12 playoff seasons, the team has posted winning preseason records on five occasions. The team has produced a .500 record three times and had a losing preseason mark four times.

Rex Ryan was named the 15th full-time head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2009.

For Rex, it is a sort of homecoming, returning to the franchise he first experienced in 1968 when his father, Buddy, was hired as the defensive line coach under Weeb Ewbank. That season culminated in the Jets' Super Bowl III victory in Miami with a six-year-old Rex Ryan watching from the stands in the Orange Bowl.

Ryan spent the last 10 seasons with the Baltimore Ravens, including 2008 as assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. During Ryan's tenure, the Ravens defense never ranked lower than sixth in the NFL. From 1999-2008, the Ravens ranked first for fewest points allowed (17.1 per game), fewest rushing yards allowed per game (87.3), most shutouts (9), most take-aways (337), most interceptions (212), most interceptions for touchdowns (29) and third-down conversion defense (33.9 percent).

Ryan began his Ravens career as the defensive line coach for Brian Billick in 1999, when the Ravens defense finished second in the NFL in total defense and second against the run. In 2000, the Ravens defense allowed the fewest points in a 16-game season in NFL history (165) en route to winning Super Bowl XXXV.

Ryan was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2005. During his four seasons in that role, the Ravens defense finished fifth (2005), first (2006), sixth (2007) and second (2008) in the NFL. In 2006, the defense allowed only 201 points and 264 yards per game as Ryan was named NFL Assistant Coach of the Year by Pro Football Weekly and the Pro Football Writers Association.

In 2008, new Head Coach John Harbaugh named Ryan assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. The Ravens 2008 defense allowed 261.1 yards per game, marking the fourth time since 1999 the Ravens finished second overall in the NFL.

Before joining the Ravens, Ryan was a defensive coordinator in college at Oklahoma (1998) and Cincinnati (1996-97). His first NFL coaching stint was with the Arizona Cardinals under his father, when he oversaw the defensive line in 1994 and linebackers in 1995. Ryan has also coached at Morehead State (1990-93), New Mexico Highlands (1989) and Eastern Kentucky (1987-88).

Ryan, 46, graduated from Stevenson High School in Prairie View, IL, and played football at SW Oklahoma State. He earned his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Physical Education at Eastern Kentucky in 1988.

Ryan was born in Ardmore, OK. He and his wife, Michelle, have two sons, Payton, named for Walter Payton, and Seth.

Andy Reid has earned NFL coach of the year honors twice, compiled the best win total (107), winning percentage (.607), and playoff victory total (10) in team history. He has captured five division titles and made five trips to the NFC Championship game. Since he was hired by Philadelphia in 1999, no other franchise has earned more Divisional Playoff round appearances (7) than the Eagles. Among coaches with 100 games under their belt entering 2009, Reid's .607 overall winning percentage is 16th in NFL history and second among active coaches behind New England's Bill Belichick (.632). In his 16-year NFL coaching career, Reid's teams have made the playoffs 13 times (19-12 record). He has coached in the Super Bowl three times, the NFC Championship game eight times, and in the Pro Bowl four times.

Reid became the 20th head coach in franchise history on January 11, 1999, and was promoted to head coach/executive vice president of football operations in 2001. He was named NFL coach of the year in 2000 and 2002. He joined the Eagles after a seven-year stint as an assistant coach with Green Bay (1992-98) under Mike Holmgren. With Green Bay, Reid helped the Packers earn a Super Bowl XXXI victory over New England.

First signed with the Falcons as an undrafted free agent in April 2009 before signing with the Jets, 6/15. Played linebacker in college, starting 36 games at Missouri, registering 319 tackles, including 105 as a senior.

#23 Shonn Greene

Selected by the Jets with the first pick of the third round, No. 65 overall in the 2009 NFL Draft. In 33 games at Iowa, he started 13 games, rushing for 2,228 yards and 22 touchdowns. STL, 8/14:** Started and recorded three catches for 52 yards, including two catches for 40 yards from Mark Sanchez on a touchdown drive.

#46 Jack Simmons

Signed as an undrafted free agent after earning a contract in the Jets tryout camp after the 2009 NFL Draft. Was a three-year starter, appearing in 41 games at Minnesota. Finished with 73 career receptions for 762 yards and three touchdowns.

Responsible for 257 ST tackles in 188 career games. Has played in 103 consecutive games. Three-time Pro Bowler on special teams (2000, 2002 and 2004). Special teams captain nine times, including all eight seasons with NE.

Played in 12 games in 2008, making 10 tackles and forcing a fumble on special teams. While with PHI, produced two sacks and two forced fumbles vs. the Jets during the preseason finale at PHI, 8/30/07.

#97 Calvin Pace

Chosen as the third alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008 while establishing career highs in sacks, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries. He posted 67 tackles, a team-leading 12 tackles-for-loss, 7.0 sacks, nine pressures, three passes defended, five forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries, including a 50-yard return for a touchdown. He was originally drafted by ARI 18th overall in 2003. **Vs. STL, 8/14:** Recorded a sack. **At BAL, 8/24:** Recorded one sack for nine yards

#47 Brandon Renkert

Spent 2008 on the Jets practice squad after he signed in July. Originally a walk-on at Rutgers, recorded six sacks over his final two seasons with 18 tackles-for-loss. In his first season as a linebacker was sixth on the team with 54 tackles (25 solo), 3.5 sacks, 11.5 stops for losses and two pressures in 13 starts.

#57 Bart Scott

Signed as an unrestricted free agent Feb. 28. Originally an undrafted free agent in 2002 with BAL, has played 109 games, starting 58, logging 508 tackles, 16 sacks, three interceptions, 23 passes defended, three forced fumbles and four fumbles recovered. Earned a Pro Bowl appearance in 2006. **At NYG, 8/29:** Caused a forced fumble and recovered a fumble.

#99 Bryan Thomas

Played in 109 regular-season games with 64 starts, recording 317 tackles, 23 sacks, five forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and five passes defended after being drafted by the Jets with the 22nd overall pick in 2002. Moved from defensive end to linebacker in 2006 when team changed to 3-4 defense. In 2008, recorded 47 tackles, 11 tackles-for-loss, 5.5 sacks, one fumble recovery, three forced fumbles, seven quarterback hurries and one pass defended.

#96 Jason Trusnik

#35 Rashad Barksdale

Claimed off waivers from NYG, June 25. Played in six games for KC in 2007, recording nine tackles. Originally drafted 201st overall (sixth round) of the 2007 Draft by PHI after playing at SUNY Albany, where he walked on in 2006. Started 10 games at Albany and recorded 37 tackles and three interceptions.

#31 Ahmad Carroll

Appeared in 51 games, starting 28 times over four seasons after being drafted 25th overall by GB in 2004. Has recorded 104 tackles, 24 passes defended, three sacks and three interceptions. Signed with the Jets in July 2008 and finished tied with Wallace Wright for first with 26 special teams tackles. **At NYG, 8/29:** Sacked David Carr for an 11-yard loss.

#34 Marquice Cole

Attended training camp with OAK in 2007 and TEN in 2008. Played in 43 games at Northwestern where he was named to the Thorpe Award preseason watch list. Totaled 114 tackles, seven interceptions and one sack in his career. **At BAL, 8/24:** Recorded an interception that he returned 25 yards.

#30 Drew Coleman

Since being drafted 189th overall (sixth round) in 2006, has played 36 games in three seasons, starting four, recording 44 tackles, one interception, two sacks and a forced fumble. Has registered 16 tackles on special teams.

#38 Emanuel Cook

Signed as an undrafted free agent in May 2009. Led South Carolina in tackles the past two seasons. Totaled 179 tackles, five pass breakups, three interceptions and two forced fumbles.

#44 James Ihedigbo

Originally signed by the Jets in May 2007 and spent the season on Injured Reserve. Played in eight NFL games in 2008, recording 11 tackles on special teams.

#36 Jim Leonhard

A veteran of 54 NFL games with 20 starts, recorded 144 tackles, one sack, three interceptions, nine passes defended and one touchdown. Signed by the Jets in March 2009 after spending 2008 with BAL. Originally signed by BUF in 2005 as an undrafted free agent. Also recorded 19 special teams tackles, 326 yards on 31 punt returns (10.5 avg.) and 249 yards on 11 kick-off returns (22.6 avg.).

Played in all 16 games, starting the first 10 in his rookie season with 58 tackles, one interception, five forced fumbles and 17 passes defended after being selected 114th overall (fourth round) in 2008.

#24 Darrelle Revis

Started all 32 games in his career after being drafted 14th overall in 2007, and has recorded 150 tackles, one sack, eight interceptions, one touchdown, 28 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Earned his first Pro Bowl selection in 2008 after finishing the season with 59 tackles, five interceptions, 15 passes defended, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, as well as his first career sack and first career interception return for touchdown. **Did not dress (hamstring) vs. STL, 8/14 , at BAL, 8.24.**

#25 Kerry Rhodes

Chosen as the third alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008. Started 64 consecutive games to begin his NFL career. Selected 123rd overall (fourth round), recording 349 tackles, 12 interceptions, nine sacks, 30 passes defended, five forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries, including an 11-yard return for a touchdown. Led the Jets secondary in tackles in 2008 with 81.

#26 Lito Sheppard

Acquired by the Jets in Feb. 2009 in a trade with PHI. Two-time Pro Bowl selection (2005, 06) has recorded 256 tackles (199 solo), two sacks, 18 interceptions (three for touchdowns), 49 passes defended, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery while seeing action in 93 games with 61 starts after being selected with the 26th overall pick in 2002. Was the first player to post two interceptions with returns of 100-or-more yards in his career (10/8/06 vs. DAL, QB Drew Bledsoe, 102 yards; 11/15/04 at DAL, QB Vinny Testaverde, 101 yards).

#33 Eric Smith

Played in 39 games, starting 10, in three seasons since being drafted 97th overall (third round) in 2006. Posted 84 tackles, three interceptions and one fumble recovered, along with 11 passes defended. In 2008, played in nine games, starting six, recording 32 tackles, one tackle-for-loss, four passes defended, one fumble recovery and an interception.

#27 Donald Strickland

Signed by the Jets in March 2009 as an unrestricted free agent. Played in 49 games, making 22 starts and recording 160 tackles, two interceptions, 16 passes defended, one forced fumble and 12 special teams tackles for IND, PHI and SF. Was originally drafted 90th overall (3rd round) by IND in 2003. Finished 2008 season with a career-high 44 tackles, six passes defended and seven special team tackles. Recorded a sack in the preseason opener **vs. STL, 8/14. Did Not Dress (foot) at BAL, 8/24.**

Specialists (5)

Incumbent punter **Reggie Hodges** faces a challenge from newly-signed **Kenneth Parrish**. **Jay Feely** is in his second season and first training camp as the Jets placekicker while snapper **James Dearth** has held that position since 2001. Kick returns will be handled by Pro Bowler **Leon Washington** while safety **Jim Leonhard** steps in as the lead punt returner.

#85 James Dearth

The Jets long-snapper since 2001 has appeared in 128 consecutive games. Has one special teams tackle.

#7 Parker Douglass

Picked up by the Jets Aug. 12, he originally signed as a free agent May 15, 2009 with CLE and was waived July 31. Prior to signing with the Browns, he played with the Sioux Falls Storm of the Indoor Football League (IFL), converting 15-of-27 field goals and 31-of-36 PAT. At South Dakota State, he broke or tied 19 kicking records.

#3 Jay Feely

Entering his ninth year, was signed by the Jets, 9/10/08. In 2008, hit 24-of-28 field goals, including his last 14 in a row, and was 39-for-39 on extra-point attempts for 111 points, the fifth 100-point season of his career. Hit a 55-yard FG, tying his career high and Jets franchise record, 11/9/08 vs. STL.

#5 Reggie Hodges

During the preseason he has averaged 41.4 yards on five punts with three inside the 20-yard line. Played the final 12 games for the Jets after he was signed by 9/17/08, averaging 42.8 yards per punt gross/35.5 net on 44 punts, with 14 inside-the-20.

#9 Glenn Pakulak

Averaged 47.7 yards per punt in eight games with the Saints in 2008. Claimed by the Jets on Aug. 28 after he was waived by New Orleans on Aug. 27. Has also punted in NFL Europe and has been with the Steelers, Falcons, Seahawks, Titans and Bears since he was a 2002 finalist for the Ray Guy Award at the University of Kentucky.
