HEAD COACHES

JETS HEAD COACH REX RYAN

(FIRST YEAR AT JETS)

Rex Ryan was named the 15th full-time head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2009.

For Rex, it is a sort of homecoming, returning to the franchise he first experienced in 1968 when his father, Buddy, was hired as the defensive line coach under Weeb Ewbank. That season culminated in the Jets' Super Bowl III victory in Miami with a six-year-old Rex Ryan watching from the stands in the Orange Bowl.

Ryan spent the last 10 seasons with the Baltimore Ravens, including 2008 as assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. During Ryan's tenure, the Ravens defense never ranked lower than sixth in the NFL. From 1999-2008, the Ravens ranked first for fewest points allowed (17.1 per game), fewest rushing yards allowed per game (87.3), most shutouts (9), most take-aways (337), most interceptions (212), most interceptions for touchdowns (29) and third-down conversion defense (33.9 percent).

Ryan began his Ravens career as the defensive line coach for Brian Billick in 1999, when the Ravens defense finished second in the NFL in total defense and second against the run. In 2000, the Ravens defense allowed the fewest points in a 16-game season in NFL history (165) en route to winning Super Bowl XXXV.

Ryan was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2005. During his four seasons in that role, the Ravens defense finished fifth (2005), first (2006), sixth (2007) and second (2008) in the NFL. In 2006, the defense allowed only 201 points and 264 yards per game as Ryan was named NFL Assistant Coach of the Year by Pro Football Weekly and the Pro Football Writers Association.

In 2008, new Head Coach John Harbaugh named Ryan assistant head coach/defensive coordinator. The Ravens 2008 defense allowed 261.1 yards per game, marking the fourth time since 1999 the Ravens finished second overall in the NFL.

Before joining the Ravens, Ryan was a defensive coordinator in college at Oklahoma (1998) and Cincinnati (1996-97). His first NFL coaching stint was with the Arizona Cardinals under his father, when he oversaw the defensive line in 1994 and linebackers in 1995. Ryan has also coached at Morehead State (1990-93), New Mexico Highlands (1989) and Eastern Kentucky (1987-88).

Ryan, 46, graduated from Stevenson High School in Prairie View, IL, and played football at SW Oklahoma State. He earned his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Physical Education at Eastern Kentucky in 1988.

Ryan was born in Ardmore, OK. He and his wife, Michelle, have two sons, Payton, named for Walter Payton, and Seth.

TEXANS HEAD COACH GARY KUBIAK

(FOURTH YEAR AT TEXANS)
22-26

Gary Kubiak was introduced as the second head coach in Houston Texans history on January 26, 2006. Kubiak returned to Houston after spending 20 of the previous 23 years in the Denver area. Kubiak's record as Texans head coach is 22-26, making him the franchise's winningest head coach. In his first year as a head coach, Kubiak guided the Texans to a 6-10 record, tripling the team's win total of the year before. In 2007, the Texans broke even for the first time, finishing at 8-8. Houston went 7-3 outside of the AFC West and set a franchise record with a 6-2 mark at home. It was the first time the Texans posted a winning mark at Reliant Stadium.

In 2008, the Texans overcame an 0-4 start that was due in part to the damage inflicted by Hurricane Ike and finished 8-8. Houston's 8-4 record of the 12 games was the third-best in the league, and the team became just the ninth squad NFL history to finish .500 or better after an 0-4 start.

Kubiak spent the previous 11 seasons (1995-2005) as Denver's offensive coordinator, helping guide the Broncos to back-to-back World Championships in Superbowls XXXII and XXXIII and three AFC West Division titles. Kubiak began his coaching career as the running backs coach at Texas A&M (1992-93). Kubiak started his NFL coaching career with the San Francisco 49ers as the quarterbacks coach, winning Super Bowl XXIX in his only season (1994). Kubiak is a veteran of six Super Bowls—three as a player and three as a coach.

Kubiak starred at quarterback for Texas A&M from 1979-1982, earning all-Southwest Conference honors as a senior. He played for the Broncos from 1983-1991 as John Elway's backup. Kubiak played in 119 career games, tossed 14 touchdowns, and was a part of three teams that reached the Super Bowl.

Kubiak was born August 15, 1961 in Houston. He and his wife, Rhonda, have three sons—Klint, Klay, and Klein.

- **On his philosophy:** We have a philosophy here - you've heard of the K.I.S.S. philosophy, which is 'Keep It Simple Stupid,' that's for somebody else. Ours is a K.I.L.L. philosophy; we're going to 'Keep It Likable and Learnable.'
- **On preparation:** You're going to see our aggressive mentality through our preparation. You're going to see that on the practice field. We either go through it walk-through speed or full speed. That's how you do things here, and that's how we're going to get it done. You can't expect a guy to know how to play on Sunday when he hasn't seen it throughout the week. So we go full speed, and that's the way it's going to get done.
- **On being aggressive:** You're going to see an attack team here. We're going to be aggressive on both sides of the ball and with our special teams. It's all about our team here. It's a team concept that we're going to have with the Jets. Our offense is going to pick up our defense. Our defense will pick up our offense and our special teams will pick us up on both sides of the ball.
- **On the offense and defense:** Our offense is going to build up our defense by the way we work against each other, and vice versa. Some games our offense may need to score 21 points. Sometimes our defense may need to shut them out. We're always going to pick each other up. It's about a team; it's not one side versus the other side, but we're going to compete against each other in practice.
- **On being a physical football team:** We will be an aggressive football team and a physical football team. We want to have an all weather offense and that starts with a running game, being able to run the football, because I think it's important. You've got to win when the snow falls to get where you want to go, and that's to win Super Bowls.

- **On taking on this challenge:** The only way I know how to handle a challenge is to hit that thing head on, and that's what we're going to do. The message to the rest of the league is, 'hey, the Jets are coming, and we're going to give you everything we've got, and that's going to be, I think, more than you can handle.' We're going to find out.
- **On his coaching staff:** There is no way that I could have envisioned putting together this kind of coaching staff. This is an all-star staff that I feel extremely fortunate to have. I am confident in my abilities, but I am a lot more confident in the abilities of these men. It's not something where these guys are working for me, they are working with me. It's our collective efforts that will lead this football team.
- **On going from defensive coordinator to head coach:** They always say until you go through it, you think you understand, but you really don't understand the other commitments that you do have, but it's a great thing. You prepare all your life for it, so these decisions that you're making, all that experience you've had being around great coaches, which I have, it makes it much easier...I'm kind of a head coach/coordinator and I told Mike Pettine he's kind of the same thing also. I'm going to lean on him as well, and (Bill) Callahan can put that on there as slash head coach. So can Schotty (Brian Schottenheimer). So can Mike Westhoff. It's a collective effort, so that's a good thing. It is funny. I even asked (Steve) Spagnuolo if he was calling the defenses and he said 'no' because there are so many administrative things. I have a tough time doing that. You work all your life to get to this spot. One of the reasons you get here is because you're probably pretty decent at what you do and to just turn it completely over and then if it doesn't go right, you have somebody else to blame instead of just putting it on yourself. If our defense doesn't do well, then that's going to be a reflection on me. Of course if our team doesn't (do well), it's a reflection on me also, but I can handle it. I think we'll be successful in all aspects of our team, not just based on me but on the players we have and the coaches we have and our support staff. It's hard for me to imagine us not being successful.

Coach Ryan, who first experienced the Jets at age six when his father Buddy was an assistant coach from 1968-75, has embraced the Jets history:

- Historic team pictures adorn the hallways.
- Individual record holders and Pro Bowlers are honored on the walls outside the meeting rooms.
- Framed jerseys of Joe Namath, Winston Hill and Gerry Philbin hang in his office.
- The all-time numerical roster hangs outside the locker room so that current players see who wore their numbers before them.

SPOTLIGHTING THE O-LINE

For the first time since the 2001 season, the Jets return the same five starters on the offensive line from the previous season. The Jets were one of only six teams (CHI, DEN, HOU, NYG, ARI) where all five offensive linemen started all 16 games in 2008.

The 2008 Jets were the first team to start four first-round draft picks on the offensive line since the 2002 Steelers (**Alan Faneca, Wayne Gandy, Jeff Hartings** and **Kendall Simmons**).

The 2008 signings of unrestricted free agents Faneca and **Damien Woody**, and the 2008 addition of Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line **Bill Callahan**, a former head coach on both the NFL and college levels, spearheaded the Jets improvement on the line in 2008.

2008 Highlights:

- The Jets led the NFL in ball control with 30 five-minute drives and 15 touchdowns on five-minute drives.
- The Jets scored 25.3 points per game, ninth in the NFL, which included a franchise-record 115 points in a three-game Nov. stretch (vs. STL, at NE, at TEN).
- The Jets were ninth in the NFL in rushing (125.3 yards per game) and third at 4.7 yards per carry.
- **Thomas Jones** led the AFC in rushing with 1,312 yards and set franchise records with 15 touchdowns and 13 rushing touchdowns.
- The Jets allowed 30 sacks in 2008, down from 51 sacks in 2007.
- The Jets rushed for 4.7 yards per carry and scored 20 rushing touchdowns in 2008, compared to 3.8 yards per carry and six rushing touchdowns in 2007.

2008 AT A GLANCE

- The Jets led the NFL with seven Pro Bowl players: **OL Alan Faneca, NT Kris Jenkins, RB Thomas Jones** and **KR Leon Washington** were named starters, while **C Nick Mangold, CB Darrelle Revis** and former Jets **QB Brett Favre**, were named reserves.
- The Jets scored 405 total points in 2008, the third-highest total in team history, trailing only the 1968 team (419 in 14 games) and the 1998 team (416 in 16 games).
- The 48 touchdowns ranked second in team history, trailing only the 51 scored in 1960, the inaugural year of the franchise.
- The Jets 2008 Curtis Martin Team MVP **Thomas Jones** established a new Jets record for total touchdowns with 15 and rushing touchdowns with 13.

- **Leon Washington's** 2,332 combined yards led the NFL and set a new Jets single-season record.
- **Dustin Keller's** 48 receptions were the most ever by a Jets rookie tight end and the fourth-highest total by a rookie in franchise history.

PRO BOWL RUNNING BACK THOMAS JONES

Thomas Jones led the AFC and finished fifth in the NFL in 2008 with 1,312 yards on 290 carries (4.5). He led the team with a career-best and franchise-record 15 touchdowns, including a team-record 13 rushing touchdowns.

- Jones was voted the 2008 **Curtis Martin Team MVP** and 2008 **Dennis Byrd Most Inspirational Player** by his teammates.
- He became the 49th back in NFL history to surpass 7,000 rushing yards (currently 7,815 yards, 42nd in NFL history).
- Jones scored a touchdown in eight consecutive games in 2008 (Weeks 8-15), a new franchise record. The team is 10-2 in games in which Jones has scored a touchdown over the past two seasons, including 8-2 in 2008.
- Included in Jones' 138-yard, two-touchdown game vs. DEN, 11/30/08, was a 59-yard scoring run in the first quarter, the longest touchdown run of his career, eclipsing his long of 58 yards for ARI at SEA, 9/15/02. His career long is a 61-yarder at GB, 11/16/03 for TB. In the second quarter, Jones rolled over DEN DL **Kenny Peterson** and kept his balance for a 29-yard touchdown run.
- Jones' 59-yard touchdown run vs. DEN, 11/30/08 pushed him over 1,000 rushing yards for the fourth consecutive season (his second as a Jet) and marked the 14th time a Jets running back has rushed for over 1,000 yards in a season.
- Rushed for back-to-back 100 yard games for the first time since 2006 when he was with CHI (at NYG, 11/12; at NYJ, 11/19) and the first time by a Jet since 2004, when **Curtis Martin** rushed for over 100 yards in three straight games, 9/12 vs. CIN, 9/19 at SD and 10/3 at MIA, in 2004.
- At NE, 11/13/08, he put up 104 yards and a touchdown on a season-high 30 carries.
- Posted 149 yards and three rushing scores (second three-TD game) vs. STL, 11/9/08, the fourth-highest rushing total of his career.
- At BUF, 11/2/08, Jones accounted for 40 yards on the key fourth-quarter scoring drive that sealed the win.
- Recorded first career three-touchdown game vs. CIN, 10/12/08, scoring on two runs (7, 1) and a two-yard reception from **Brett Favre**.
- Logged his second-highest rushing total of his career, 159 yards (6.6 avg.) at OAK, 10/19/08.
- Jones hit for 101 yards and a touchdown in the season opener at MIA, 9/7/08.

NOV. '08 AFC PLAYER OF MONTH

Thomas Jones was named the AFC Offensive Player of the Month for Nov. 2008 when he led the AFC in rushing yards (556) and rushing touchdowns (7) as the Jets posted a 4-1 record, including three road wins at BUF, NE and TEN. During the month, Jones averaged 111.2 rush yards per game in Nov. and posted three 100-yard games (149, 104, 138). Against STL, 11/9, Jones recorded a career-high three rushing touchdowns and totaled his best rushing total of the month with 149 yards. Jones closed out the month against DEN, 11/30, gaining 138 rushing yards and reached the 1,000-yard mark for the fourth consecutive season (second with Jets). Jones also added 13 receptions for 95 receiving yards (7.3 average) with one touchdown in Nov. This was Jones' first career Player of the Month Award. He was the first Jets running back to win the award since Curtis Martin (Sept. 2000).

- At NE, 11/13/08, Washington returned a kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown to break the franchise record with his fourth career touchdown return. He also capped the game's opening drive with a seven-yard touchdown reception.

MAXIMUM IMPACT

In the Jets 28-24 win over KC, 10/26/08, the full effect of **Washington's** ability to impact a game by running, receiving and returning was on display as he impacted all four Jets touchdowns, producing a career-high 274 combined yards.

- **First quarter:** He scored on an 18-yard catch-and-run, the first receiving touchdown of his career, to complete the Jets 73-yard drive after the opening kickoff.
- **Second quarter:** On second-and-four, Washington broke quickly through the line and never stopped on his 60-yard touchdown run. It was the longest run by a Jet since **LaMont Jordan's** 61-yard scoring run, at SD, 11/3/02, and the second-longest run by the Jets this season, bested only by Washington's 61-yard touchdown run at TEN, 11/23.
- **Third quarter:** On third-and-eight at the KC 10, Washington took a short pass in the left flat and earned the first down at the two-yard line. **Thomas Jones** scored a one-yard touchdown two plays later to complete the 13-play drive.
- **Fourth quarter:** Washington fielded a punt at the Jets 17 and returned it 37 yards, setting **Brett Favre** up at the KC 46 and establishing the tone for the winning touchdown pass six plays later.

LEON BEST IN COMBINED YARDS

Leon Washington led the NFL in combined yards this season with 2,332, setting a new franchise record which was previously set by **Bruce Harper** in 1978 (2,157).

HEADS-UP PLAY LEADS TO TD

With 3:32 to go in the third quarter at BUF, 11/2/08, and the Jets holding a 16-10 lead, the Bills' **Rian Lindell** kicked off to **Leon Washington**. As the ball dribbled down the sideline, Washington put one foot out-of-bounds and grabbed the ball. After a few seconds and a quick discussion between two officials, a flag was thrown. By rule, that is a kickoff out-of-bounds and the Jets were awarded the ball on the 40-yard line. Four plays, 60-yards later, **Thomas Jones** scored from seven yards to extend the Jets lead, 23-10.



JERRICHO'S TIME

Jerricho Cotchery enters 2009 having led the Jets in receptions for two straight seasons. He posted 71 catches for 858 yards and five touchdowns (team-leading 12.1 yards per catch) last year, surpassing 70 receptions for the third straight season.

- He is the second Jets receiver in franchise history to record three consecutive seasons of 70-or-more receptions (**Keyshawn Johnson** - 1997, 98, 99) and the fourth in franchise history to record at least three seasons of 70-or-more receptions (**Laveranues Coles** - 2002, 05, 06, 08 and **Al Toon** - 1986, 88, 91 are the others).
- In the second quarter at NE, 11/13/08, with the score 17-6, the Jets got the ball on their own 13. Five plays later, Cotchery stretched the ball into the end zone, completing a touchdown drive in which he had three receptions for 79 yards. Two plays before the 15-yard touchdown catch, Cotchery pulled in a 46-yarder with one hand, against his helmet, while being interfered with, to get the Jets to the NE 16. The drive started with an 18-yard Cotchery reception. The Jets went on to win this game, 34-31 in overtime.

TAKING A CHANSI

- **WR Chansi Stuckey** finished 2008 with 32 receptions for 359 yards and three touchdowns, catching a touchdown in each of his first three NFL games, the first player to do so since **Andre Davis** and **Donte Stallworth** in 2002.
- Stuckey turned in a solid 2009 preseason (6-81, one touchdown). The highlight was his 31-yard touchdown grab from **Mark Sanchez** vs. NYG, 8/29. He caught the pass from a pressured Sanchez on the dead run at around the 12-yard line, tight-roped the sideline and broke multiple tackles to get into the end zone.
- His first NFL touchdown came on fourth-and-13 from the MIA 22 in the second quarter of the 2008 opener, 9/7/08 at MIA, when he made a leaping catch at the goal line on a pass thrown by **Brett Favre**. Stuckey became the first Jets player to score a touchdown in his NFL debut, excluding 1987 replacement games, since safety **Darrol Ray** returned a fumble 75 yards in a season-opening, 17-14 loss to the Colts, 28 years earlier to the day, 9/7/80. The last Jet to score on offense in his NFL debut was tight end **Mickey Shuler**, who caught a one-yard touchdown pass from **Richard Todd** in the Jets 33-20 win over MIA, 9/1/78.

KELLER A BIG TARGET AT TE

Rookie TE **Dustin Keller** emerged as an effective target in his rookie season in 2008.

- He led the Jets over the last eight games of the season with 35 catches for 388 yards and a touchdown, which tied for third among all tight ends in the NFL.
- Among all rookie tight ends, Keller was second with 48 catches for 535 yards and three touchdowns in 2008, trailing only SEA's **John Carlson** (55-627-5 TD).
- At NE 11/13/08, Keller logged a team-high eight catches for 87 yards, including five third down conversions in the Jets 34-31 overtime victory. Arguably, his biggest play of that night came in overtime on third-and-15, when he caught a ball over the middle and pushed through safety **Brandon Meriweather** for 16 yards and a first down. In that overtime, he caught three passes for 32 yards as the Jets drove 64 yards on 14 plays before **Jay Feely** kicked the winning 34-yard field goal.

PREPARING FOR 'THE CLOWN'

- **WR David Clowney** is coming off his second consecutive productive preseason. In the 2009 preseason, he registered seven receptions for 243 yards (ranked 2nd in the AFC), 34.7 ypc and three touchdowns, the highest average in the NFL for players with more than one catch.
- In the 2008 preseason, he recorded eight catches for an NFL-best 222 yards (27.8) and two touchdowns before getting injured in the second preseason game.
- His regular season career has been limited to two games in 2008. In his debut vs. BUF, 12/14/08, he made a nifty one-handed grab on pass from **Brett Favre** for his only career reception.

THE VERSATILE MR. SMITH

THE ODD COUPLE INSIDE

- The loquacious Bart Scott and quiet David Harris make an interesting pair in the middle of the Jets defense. Scott is a 2006 Pro Bowler who signed with the Jets as a UFA this off-season and Harris is a third-year pro who became the first rookie since 1979 to lead the Jets in tackles in 2007.
- **REX RYAN ON HARRIS:** *He's a run-hit guy. He loves to play. He wishes it was a baseball schedule, 162 games. One of those types of deals because man, he can go.*
- **RYAN ON SCOTT:** *I think you'll enjoy watching Bart play as well. Statistically, I don't know how many tackles he makes. He knocks the guard out first play of the game (vs. STL in the preseason opener), so you get to see that.*
- **RYAN ON THE PAIR:** *Those two inside backers, that's a great combination. I'll go out on a limb and say that those two, in my opinion, are the best duo in the league. ...I think those two, right there, are going to be phenomenal together. You've got Bart. He speaks a lot for both of them (laughter). They counteract.*

THE BIG MAN IN THE MIDDLE

- **Kris Jenkins** was acquired by the Jets before the 2008 season in a trade with CAR, and was voted to his fourth Pro Bowl, honored as a starter in 2008.
- He was awarded the AFC Player of the Week for Week Nine at BUF, 11/2/08, Jenkins' first career Player of the Week honor. Jenkins recorded three tackles, 1.5 sacks and three quarterback pressures as the Jets defeated BUF, 26-17. He was the first Jet to win the award since **Shaun Ellis** in 2007.
- By the midpoint of the 2008 season, Jenkins was an NFL MVP candidate, making the *Pro Football Weekly* Midseason All-Pro team and was on Peter King's list of midseason league MVPs, along with eventual Super Bowl quarterbacks **Kurt Warner** and **Ben Roethlisberger**.
- Jenkins blocked the fourth kick of his career vs. ARI, 9/28/08, getting a hand on **Neil Rackers'** 37-yard attempt.

DOUGLAS QUIETLY GETS IT DONE

One of the lesser talked-about moves of this offseason was the Jets signing of unheralded eight-year veteran DE **Marques Douglas** as a free agent. Douglas, who spent 2008 with BAL after the Ravens re-acquired him from TB in training camp in 2008, has played every game (96) for the last six seasons and has been among the most effective players in the league in tackling rushers behind the line of scrimmage. Douglas entered the league as an undrafted rookie free agent with BAL in 1999, and at one point was given very little chance of making the NFL by then BAL defensive line coach Rex Ryan.

REX AND THE REX-PERTS

The reshaping of the Jets, specifically the defense, started with the hiring of Head Coach Rex Ryan on Jan. 21 from the Baltimore Ravens. Ryan has spent the last four seasons at the helm of the Ravens defense, long considered one of the best units in the NFL.

Ryan's first hire was Ravens OLB Coach **Mike Pettine** as the Jets defensive coordinator. Next came **Dennis Thurman**, who had left the Ravens in 2008 after six years in Baltimore, to coach the Jets defensive backs.

Once the free agency period began, the Jets literally showed up on **Bart Scott's** doorstep to recruit the LB to New York, followed by **S Jim Leonhard**, and then on the same day, **DE Marques Douglas** and **NT Howard Green**. Of the four former Ravens signed by the Jets, only Green was initially drafted into the NFL. Douglas, Scott and Leonhard all entered the League as undrafted free agents.

Mike Westhoff has long been considered one of the finer special teams coaches in the NFL. In his ninth season with the Jets, Westhoff has guided his kickoff return unit to 11 touchdown returns by five different players. The last two, **Justin Miller** (2006) and **Leon Washington** (2008), earned Pro Bowl berths. The Jets 11 kickoff returns for touchdowns from 2001-08 are the most in the NFL in that time span. NE is second with eight, and CLE, CHI and BUF are tied for third with seven.

But it's not just touchdowns, in Westhoff's eight seasons, the Jets were among the top four in average drive start after kickoffs six times, and only out of the top six once in eight seasons.

In fifth place is Jets offensive lineman **Randy Rasmussen**, a member of the Super Bowl III team, who played in 144 consecutive games.

The Jets signed veteran K Jay Feely after Week 1 in 2008, and all Feely did was rack up 111 points, including 24-of-28 field goals (85.7 percent). He had the fourth-most accurate season in Jets history and his point total was the ninth-best season in the franchise's history. He tied a franchise record when he connected on a 55-yard field goal vs. STL, 11/9/08 and hit his last 14 field goal attempts in 2008, which stands as the fifth-longest streak in franchise history.

FOURTH-ROUND SUCCESS

In the last four NFL Drafts in which the Jets have had at least one selection in the fourth round (the Jets did not have a fourth-round selection in (2007 or 2009), the team has found a significant contributor in the fourth round.

- In 2008, **Dwight Lowery**, the 113th overall pick, played in all 16 games his rookie season, starting the first 10, recording 58 tackles, one interception, five forced fumbles and 17 passes defended.
- In 2006, the Jets were awarded the 117th selection in the fourth round of the draft from KC as compensation for **Herman Edwards**. The Jets selected **Leon Washington**, who became a Pro Bowl returner in 2008, leading the NFL with 2,332 combined yards. He has returned four kickoffs for touchdowns in his career, a Jets franchise record. The Jets first selection in the fourth round in 2006 was Brad Smith, a college quarterback from Missouri, who has contributed as a wide receiver and running back, and has played a significant role on special teams.
- In 2005, the Jets with the 123rd overall pick, drafted safety **Kerry Rhodes**, who has started every game in his four-year career, recording 12 interceptions and nine sacks.
- In 2004, with the 108th selection, the team picked **Jerricho Cotchery** who has led the team in receptions for two consecutive seasons and has recorded three straight seasons of 70-or-more receptions.

- Jets compiled 18 sacks, the most by an NFL team in a four-game preseason since NE in 2003.
- Jets led the NFL in points scored per game (27.0) in the preseason and their 108 points was the most the Jets have scored in a four-game preseason since 1997.
- Two Jets QBs posted passer ratings of 100-or-higher, **Erik Ainge** (113.9) and **Mark Sanchez** (111.0).

GAME-BY-GAME REVIEW

Jets 38, Eagles 27 (9/3/09 - Meadowlands)

- Jets scored the most points in preseason game since 1999 vs. MIN (38-17, 9/3/99) behind two rushing touchdowns by **Danny Woodhead** (158 yards rushing) and two touchdown passes from **Erik Ainge**.
- **Mark Sanchez** completed one touchdown drive, 5-for-5 passing for 67 yards and a scoring pass, for a perfect 158.3 passer rating.
- Jets compiled seven sacks (**Kenwin Cummings, Vernon Gholston, Howard Green, Matt Kroul, Marques Murrell, Jason Trusnik** and **Jamaal Westerman**) including four on Michael Vick.

Jets 27, Giants 25 (8/29/09 - Meadowlands)

- **Rex Ryan** picked up his first win as a head coach as **Erik Ainge** hit **Aundrae Allison** with a 70-yard touchdown strike in the final four minutes to close the Jets scoring.
- Named the starter during the week prior to the game, **Mark Sanchez** finished 13-for-20 for 149 yards and one touchdown and a 104.0 passer rating, leading the Jets to 20 points while playing into the third quarter.
- The Jets defense picked up three sacks (**Jamaal Westerman, Ahmad Carroll** and **Jason Trusnik**), a **David Harris** interception and a forced fumble by **Bart Scott** in which he took the ball from **Brandon Jacobs** after losing his helmet.

Ravens 24, Jets 23 (8/24/09 - M&T Bank Stadium)

- **Leon Washington** totaled 176 combined net yards (48 rush, 35 rec, 93 kickoff returns), highlighted by a 19-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.

OVERVIEW BY POSITION

Quarterbacks (4)

2009 first-round pick **Mark Sanchez** was named the starting quarterback for the 2009 season on Aug. 26. Sanchez posted a 111.0 passer rating in the preseason, throwing for 347 yards and three touchdowns with just one interception. He is backed up by fourth-year man **Kellen Clemens**, a veteran of eight starts in 2007, was 10-of-18 for 89 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions in the 2009 preseason. Second-year man **Erik Ainge**, who led the Jets in the preseason with 435 yards and four touchdown passes and **Kevin O'Connell**, a third-round pick of NE in 2008, who was acquired via trade with DET, 9/6. O'Connell was 12-for-26 for 108 yards and two interceptions for NE in the preseason.

Running Backs (5)

The Jets feature a trio of veterans who have been to the Pro Bowl in **Thomas Jones**, **Leon Washington** and **Tony Richardson**. Jones was voted to his first Pro Bowl when he led the AFC with 1,312 yards rushing in 2008. His 15 touchdowns, including 13 on the ground, and eight consecutive games with a touchdown are all franchise records. Washington was voted to his first Pro Bowl as the AFC returner in 2008 and led the NFL in combined yards with 2,332 and scored nine touchdowns, averaging 25.6 yards per kick return (1,231 yards, one touchdown) and 10.4 per punt return (303 yards). He also totaled 448 yards rushing (six touchdowns) and 47 receptions for 355 yards receiving and two touchdowns. Richardson has played in 202 regular season games, starting 113, earning three Pro Bowl berths. The fullback has blocked for seven 1,000-yard rushing seasons in his career (Thomas Jones, Adrian Peterson, Chester Taylor, Larry Johnson and Priest Holmes- 3). This season, the Jets have added 2009 third-round choice (No. 65) **Shonn Greene**, the 2008 Doak Walker Award winner from Iowa to the mix at tailback and **Jason Davis** at fullback. Davis started three games in 2008 for CHI and was claimed off waivers, 9/6.

Wide Receivers (5)

Jerricho Cotchery leads a group featuring returning veterans **Chansi Stuckey**, **Brad Smith**, **David Clowney** and **Wallace Wright**, all who saw action for the Jets in 2008. Cotchery led the team with 71 grabs for 858 yards and five scores in 2008. In 75 career games, with 48 starts, he has registered 260 receptions (three consecutive 70-plus catch seasons) for 3,260 yards and 13 touchdowns. Stuckey, who arguably made the play of the preseason with his 31-yard catch-and-run touchdown from Mark Sanchez vs. NYG, posted three touchdowns on 32 receptions for 359 yards in 2008. He was the first Jets player to score a touchdown in his NFL debut since 1987 and the first NFL player since 2002 to catch a touchdown pass in each of his first three games. Clowney is coming off his second consecutive productive preseason. In 2009, he registered seven receptions for 243 yards, which was second in the AFC (34.7 per catch), and three touchdowns, the highest average in the NFL for players with more than one catch. In 2008, he recorded eight catches for an NFL-best 222 yards (27.8) and two touchdowns before getting injured in the second preseason game. Fourth-year veteran Smith has played in 47 games, starting 13 as both a wide receiver (11) and running back (two). He has also lined up at quarterback. His career totals include 53 receptions for 450 yards and two touchdowns and 42 rushes for 261 yards. Also is one-of-three passing for 18 yards. Wright has played in 37 games over four seasons, starting one at wide receiver. He has recorded six catches for 87 yards and two kickoff returns for 31 yards.

Tight Ends (3)

Second-year man **Dustin Keller**, drafted after the Jets traded up for the 30th pick in the first round in 2008, ranked second in the NFL in 2008 among rookie tight ends in receptions with 48 receptions for 535 yards (11.1 avg.) and three touchdowns. The Jets signed veteran **Ben Hartsock**, 9/3, after he was released by ATL. Hartsock totaled 27 receptions for 273 yards (10.1 avg.) in 56 games played and as a blocker, paved the way for three 1,000-yard rushers: Edgerrin James (2004 and 2005 for IND), LenDale White (2007 for TEN) and Michael Turner (2008 for ATL). **Matthew Mulligan** was claimed off waivers from TEN, 9/6. He had three receptions for 40 yards and a touchdown in the preseason.

Offensive Line (8)

All seven linemen from last year's roster return, including all five starters. Each started all 16 games in 2008, one of only six offensive lines to produce that level of consistency. This season also marks the first since 2001 that the Jets return their entire starting offensive line. **C Nick Mangold** was voted to his first Pro Bowl in 2008. The 29th overall pick in '06 from Ohio State has started 48 straight regular season games at center. **LG Alan Faneca**, voted to his eighth Pro Bowl in 2008, has started 169 career games, including 112 consecutive contests. **RG Brandon Moore**, originally signed as an undrafted free agent defensive lineman out of Illinois in 2002, converted to offense in 2003 and has started 73 consecutive regular season games at right guard. **LT D'Brickshaw Ferguson** was chosen as the second alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008. The fourth-overall pick in 2006 from Virginia has started 48 straight regular season games at left tackle. **RT Damien Woody** started every game at right tackle in 2008. He has played in 144 games, earning 137 starts. He previously played four seasons for DET as a guard and tackle and his first six seasons as a center in NE, including a Pro Bowl season in 2002. Reserves include: **T Wayne Hunter**, who appeared in 14 games in 2008; **C/G Rob Turner**, who appeared in 10 games in 2008; Sixth-round pick **Matt Slauson** out of Nebraska, who played three different positions in college, and started all 13 games at right guard as a senior in 2008.



OVERVIEW BY POSITION

Defensive Line (7)

New addition **Marques Douglas** joins starters **Kris Jenkins** and **Shaun Ellis** on this group that helped the Jets rank seventh in rushing yards allowed per game in 2008. Douglas has not missed a game in six seasons (96 games), and his 41.5 tackles-for-loss from 2003-08 are the third-most in the NFL (Pat Williams 49.0, Lance Briggs 44.5). Ellis, who is suspended for the season opener at HOU, was chosen as second alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008, leading the Jets with eight sacks and 12 pressures in 2008. In nine seasons, he has played in 140 games, third all-time among Jets DL, recording 61.5 sacks (fourth all-time on Jets). Jenkins was voted to his fourth Pro Bowl in 2008. He recorded 53 tackles, nine pressures, 3.5 sacks, eight tackles-for-loss, one forced fumble, two deflected passes and a blocked kick in 2008. **Mike DeVito** has appeared in 23 games as a reserve defensive end after signing as an undrafted free agent in May 2007. Backing up the nose, **Sione Pouha** has played in 46 career games, starting one, racking up 72 tackles, three deflected passes and a half-sack in his career. Veteran **Howard Green** has played in 37 games, starting 12 with BAL, NO and SEA in parts of five seasons. **Ropati Pitoitua** signed as an undrafted free agent in May 2008 and spent most of the season on the practice squad.

Linebackers (9)

Veterans **Bryan Thomas** and **Calvin Pace** start on the outside, while third-year man **David Harris** and new addition **Bart Scott** man the inside. Pace, chosen as the third alternate for the 2008 Pro Bowl, established career highs in sacks, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries. He will miss the first four games due to suspension, returning 10/12 at MIA. Thomas has played in 109 regular-season games with 64 starts, recording 23 sacks, five forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and five passes defensed. Scott signed as an unrestricted free agent Feb. 28 and has played 109 games, starting 58. He has totalled 508 tackles, 16 sacks, three interceptions, 23 passes defensed, three forced fumbles and four fumbles recovered, earning a Pro Bowl appearance in 2006. Third-year man Harris played in 27 games, starting 20, leading the team in tackles as a rookie in 2007 with 117. **Vernon Gholston**, the Jets 2008 first-round pick, will start in Pace's place at HOU, 9/13. He recorded one sack in the preseason. On the outside, **Marques Murrell** played in 12 games in 2008, making 10 tackles and forcing a fumble on special teams. **Jason Trusnik** appeared in 13 games in the last two seasons after signing as an undrafted free agent in 2007. Special teams ace **Larry Izzo** is responsible for 257 special teams tackles in 188 career regular season games and has played in 103 consecutive games dating back to 2002. He earned Pro Bowl selections on special teams in 2000, 2002 and 2004. Rutgers product **Jamaal Westerman** signed with the Jets as an undrafted free agent in 2009. He was a three-year starter at Rutgers, where he finished with 26 sacks, third highest in school history, in 50 career games, and totaled 141 tackles, including 45 behind the line of scrimmage.

Defensive Backs (11)

Highlighted by a pair of cornerbacks that were drafted in the first round and have earned Pro Bowl recognition, **Darrelle Revis** and new acquisition **Lito Sheppard** will start alongside safeties **Kerry Rhodes** and newcomer **Jim Leonhard**. Revis has started all 32 games in his career and earned his first Pro Bowl selection in 2008 after finishing the season with 59 tackles, five interceptions, 15 passes defensed, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, as well as his first career sack and first career interception return for touchdown. Sheppard was acquired by the Jets in Feb. 2009 in a trade with PHI. A two-time Pro Bowl selection (2005, 06), he has recorded 18 interceptions (three for touchdowns), three forced fumbles, two sacks and one fumble recovery while seeing action in 93 games with 61 starts after being selected by PHI with the 26th overall pick in 2002. Rhodes was chosen as the third alternate for the Pro Bowl in 2008. He has started 64 consecutive games to begin his NFL career and has 12 interceptions, nine sacks, five forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries, including an 11-yard return for a touchdown. Leonard is a veteran of 54 NFL games with 20 starts who has recorded one sack, three interceptions, including one touchdown. He has also compiled 326 yards on 31 punt returns (10.5 avg.). **CB Dwight Lowery** played in all 16 games, starting the first 10 in his rookie season. He responded with 58 tackles, one interception, five forced fumbles and 17 passes defensed. **CB Donald Strickland** has two career interceptions in six seasons for IND, PHI and SF. Fourth-year safety **Eric Smith** has played in 39 games, starting 10, posting three interceptions and one fumble recovered. **S James Ihedigbo**, who originally signed by the Jets in May 2007, spent 2007 on Injured Reserve and played in eight games in 2008. **CB Drew Coleman** has played 36 games in three seasons, starting four, recording one interception, two sacks and a forced fumble. Former first round pick **CB Ahmad Carroll** has appeared in 51 games, posting 28 starts over four seasons, recording three sacks and three interceptions. He finished 2008 tied for first on the Jets with 26 special teams tackles. **CB Marquice Cole**, who attended training camp with OAK in 2007 and TEN in 2008, provides additional depth at cornerback and on special teams.

Specialists (3)

Ninth-year **K Jay Feely** hit 24-of-28 field goals in 2008, including his last 14 in a row, and was 39-for-39 on extra-point attempts for 111 points, the fifth 100-point season of his career. Veteran **P Steve Weatherford** was signed, 9/7/09. He had eight punts for JAC for a 43.4 average in the 2009 preseason. He has punted in 46 games for JAC, KC and NO over three seasons. **LS James Dearth** has appeared in 128 consecutive games over eight seasons.
